
Welcome back to our past board member and past president Elvia Villalobos

He applied for a LACA Scholarship and LACA sponsors supported him throughout his undergraduate and graduate education. After many years of hard work, fully learning Spanish and English, and even studying abroad, Sebastian is now an ecologist and will continue to make impactful contributions to his community in the Sierra Tarahumara. Congratulations to Sebastian and many thanks to all the LACA donors who have supported him! Our president, Jesse Canchola, was able to attend both his undergraduate and graduate commencements. The dean of his school invited Sebastian to be a speaker at his graduate ceremony as he graduated magna cum laude.



Scholarship News

LACA this year has sent \$21,700 to Sr. Deisy in Panama to administer tuition and housing scholarships for 17 students from rural areas. In addition, LACA has sent \$26,278 to Sr. Marlene for 15 high school and university scholarships in El Salvador. Sr. Deisy and Sr. Marlene send detailed spreadsheets to LACA of how they allocate the funds to the universities attended by the students as well as ensuring that students retain their eligibility with at least a "B" grade average and doing volunteer work in their communities. With these scholarships, students

are learning skills in medicine, teaching, canal and agricultural engineering, law, psychology, aviation, architecture, political science, and computer science. Education breaks the cycle of poverty in their families and enables these students to find good employment in their countries instead of emigrating.
